


Tudor Rose	This was a symbol of the joining of the House of Lancaster and the House of York.

papal	Anything linked to the Pope who is head of the Catholic faith.	<input type="checkbox"/> I know that Henry VIII succeeded Henry VII and that he had six wives.	
dissolution	The ending of Catholic rule in England. (Putting an end to a partnership)	<input type="checkbox"/> I know that Henry VIII started the Church of England, made himself, head and broke away from the Catholic religion. He also got rid of the Catholic monasteries and kept all of the money.	
reformation	A religious movement in the 16 th century which moved away from the Catholic faith to create the Church of England.	<input type="checkbox"/> I know that Catholic Spain attempted, but failed to invade protestant Britain with an Armada during the reign of Elizabeth I.	
Armada	A fleet of Spanish warships.	<input type="checkbox"/> I also know the role of Sir Francis Drake and the weather in defeating the Armada.

King Henry VIII was passionate about music and was a talented musician. He played various keyboard, string, and wind instruments.
