

<b>tyranny</b>	where a country is ruled by a cruel and unfair government	<input type="checkbox"/> I understand philosophy and know the names of some Greek philosophers: Plato, Archimedes, and Pythagoras	
<b>monarchy</b>	where a country is ruled and led by the king or queen	<input type="checkbox"/> I can give examples of the legacy of the Ancient Greeks on our lives today (E.g. language, theatre, sport/Olympic Games, mathematics, inventions, philosophy, and architecture/Sir Robert Smirke).
