



Year Group 4: Geography- Anglo Saxons/Scots

<b>compass</b>	A tool for finding direction. A simple compass is a magnetic needle mounted on a pivot, or short pin. The needle always points to north.		 
<b>originated</b>	When/where something begins to happen or exist.		
<b>settlement</b>	A village, town or city where people live.

<b>town</b>	A built-up area with a name, defined boundaries and local government, that is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city.	<input type="checkbox"/> I know the countries where the Saxons/Jutes/Angles originated from and the routes they took.	
<b>village</b>	A group of houses and associated buildings larger than a hamlet and smaller than a town, situated in a rural area.	<input type="checkbox"/> I know and can label the kingdoms of the Anglo Saxon era.	
<b>city</b>	The largest type of settlement, containing lots of buildings and lots of people.	<input type="checkbox"/> I can compare land use and settlements now and then (Saxon era).	
<b>hamlet</b>	A small settlement, generally one smaller than a village and strictly (in Britain) one without a church.		
<b>Rural area</b>	Areas which are not towns or cities. They are often farming or agricultural areas.	<input type="checkbox"/> I know how towns, villages and cities gained their names during Saxon times – E.g. Stockton, is an Anglo Saxon town with the typical Anglo Saxon name ending ‘ton’ meaning farm or homestead.	<p><b>Misconceptions and Facts</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Many of the places where people live today have existed for hundreds or even thousands of years.</li> <li>They were created by early settlers to the UK including Romans, Vikings, Anglo Saxons.</li> </ul>

<b>agriculture</b>	The farming of crops or animals.
