

Conquistador	This can be linked to one of the Spanish conquerors of Mexico and Peru in the 16th century		
Aristotle	An ancient Greek philosopher (someone who studies and thinks about things)		
circumnavigation	The action or process of sailing or travelling all the way around something, especially the world.		
Sir Francis Drake	He was an English sea captain and explorer was best known for his circumnavigation (sailing around) of the world in a single expedition, from 1577 to 1580.		
Sir Walter Raleigh	He one of the most famous explorers of Elizabeth I's reign. Raleigh is usually remembered for introducing the potato and tobacco to England.	<p>Misconceptions and Facts</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Greek philosopher, Aristotle, stated in his book 'On the Heavens' that, 'Because of the stars, the Earth is circular.' People believed that the world was flat until explorers ventured beyond the horizon, mapped the Earth and brought back stories and goods from other countries.
