


## Year 1: Seasonal Change

<b>season</b>	The four parts of the year - Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter			
<b>Spring</b>	The season after winter when new vegetation grows - March, April, May			
<b>Summer</b>	The warmest season of the year (in our hemisphere) June, July August	<b>Sticky Assessment Knowledge</b>		
<b>Autumn</b>	The season after summer - September, October, November			
<b>Winter</b>	The coldest season of the year (in our hemisphere) - December, January, February	<input type="checkbox"/> observe and recall changes across the 4 seasons by looking at how trees and the clothes that we wear change from autumn to winter. <input type="checkbox"/> observe and comment on changes across the 4 seasons in the context of the weather	<b>Useful Websites</b>	
<b>months</b>	A period of time consisting of approximately 4 weeks or 28-31 days

<b>weather</b>	The state of the atmosphere regarding heat cloudiness, dryness, sun, wind, rain etc			
<b>windsock</b>	A flexible cone or cylinder-shaped instrument to show direction and strength of the wind	<input type="checkbox"/> observe and record wind direction over time and notice patterns between rainfall and wind, and changes in direction <input type="checkbox"/> record wind direction and strength using a windsock	<b>Misconceptions and Facts</b>	
<b>direction</b>	The course the wind (or someone or something) moves - north, south, east, or west)			
<b>rain gauge</b>	A device for collecting and measuring the amount of rain that falls	<input type="checkbox"/> consider what effect rain has on us and our daily lives <input type="checkbox"/> record the rainfall over a period of time using rain gauge <input type="checkbox"/> make predictions about the results from the rainfall gauges	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sun moves across the sky</li> <li>• That our bodies give off dark shadow, not that we need a light source and object to create shadow</li> </ul>	
<b>data</b>	Facts and information gathered			
<b>shadow</b>	A dark area or shape produced by a body or object coming between source of light and a surface
